EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

In 2023, our Community Employment Department experienced significant growth as we continued to support Career Seekers in their community jobs.

We forged new partnerships with businesses like the Chamber of Commerce and Partake Lounge, who added multiple positions for individuals we support.

Our Janitorial and Landscape teams made great strides in building job skills and confidence. Barry, a supported employee, expressed, "My job in Landscaping means the world to me, and I wouldn't change it for anything." This progress fostered a strong sense of pride in their work.

Our work team volunteered 1,200+ hours at the Josephine County Food Bank helping feed our local community. They provided additional support by distributing community event posters and assembling the city's monthly water bills.

Our collaboration with Gates Furniture, named Employer Partner of the Year, was a mutual success. Gates Furniture's General Manager, Ben, noted, "My experience has been an amazing one. Not only seeing the growth for us, but also the Individuals that work for us. The smiles on their faces and watching someone learn new techniques and skills, then watching their transformation."

RESIDENTIAL SUPPORTS

Our residential team made significant strides, from helping individuals fulfill bucket list dreams to remodeling homes and enjoying the community.

Southern Oregon Aspire launched a successful end-of-year campaign to fund renovations for the Oregon House, home to five incredible women. Thanks to generous community support, significant upgrades were made possible.

We are dedicated to helping people achieve their dreams. For example, one couple enjoyed bucket list trips, including the last Oregon Ducks vs. Beavers game and a dream vacation to Oahu, Hawaii!

We also ensured smooth transitions for individuals with aging needs. When a long-term resident, who's been with SOA since 1979, faced a major health event that required a stay in a rehabilitation center. We successfully brought her back to her familiar environment at SOA. We shared a warm homecoming for her and the support staff, some of whom had worked with her for over 20 years!

Southern Oregon Aspire continues to grow with a commitment to provide high-quality supports and be an employer who values its staff. Together, with both of these being at the forefront, we are *Inspiring Unlimited Opportunities for People to Create the Life T hey Choose.*



SUPPORTED LIVING

We focused on enhancing living spaces at Midstep, our apartment complex for independent-living individuals with disabilities.

We completed several renovations including new appliances, resealing the parking lot, and upgrading the surroundings. Special thanks to the Four Way Foundation, Carpenter Foundation, and Grants Pass Rotary for their crucial support in the restoration and to Stephen Edwards of Grants Pass Painting, who generously repainted the entire complex! Thanks to their community support, the residents now have a home they can take pride in.

Our Supported Living Program (SLP) also coordinated a lot of fun this year, with trips to Crater Lake, Portland, Rogue River Gorge, Wildlife Safari, deep-sea fishing, camping, rafting, and the Candy Lane Express train ride.

We are committed to meeting the diverse needs of those we support. For individuals needing more care than SLP could provide, we successfully transitioned them to our residential program, ensuring they receive the appropriate support in a comfortable environment. For many of our individuals, SOA has been their home for most of their lives, and we offer quality support in an environment that works for them so they can continue to *Live the Life They Choose*.
